

Architecture & Urban Design Workshop

Igoumenitsa, Greece, September 15-19, 2025

Description

The Columns of Brindisi, dating back to the 2nd century AD, are believed to mark the end of the Via Appia—the oldest known road of the Roman Empire. Placed on top of a public staircase in the port of Brindisi, they symbolized the transition from land to sea and, more significantly, underscored Rome's connection to the wider world and the global reach of the Empire.

Today, the port of Igoumenitsa plays a similarly vital role as a key national and European transport hub—facilitating the movement of people and goods and serving as a maritime gateway between East and West. It marks the western end of the Egnatia Highway, the principal road axis linking Europe with the Balkans and Asia. Despite this strategic importance, the modern city of Igoumenitsa remains overlooked; the speed and immediacy of the transport connection have not translated into henefit.

The upcoming workshop in architecture and urban design aims to materialize the global connectivity that Igoumenitsa represents. To that end, a select group of students from the Department of Architecture at the University of Ioannina and Sapienza University of Rome will collaborate on site-specific architectural proposals within the urban fabric of Igoumenitsa.

The workshop will be led by faculty members from both universities. Architects and representatives from academia, local authorities and the private sector will be invited to deliver introductory lectures and participate as critics during the final presentation.
